- The definition of "Employee" in section 2(9) of the Employees' State Insurance Act held vide enough to include a partner as a person employed for wages in or in connection with the work of the factory. Held that the disputed person was employee as per section 2(9) and the monthly allowance paid to him was " wages" as defined in section 2(22) of the Act.
- Maharashtra State Co-operative Bank Employees' Union, Mahal Nagpur
- Bombav Industrial Relations Act, 1946, section 13(1)— Banking Industry.— Registration of the union as a Representative union for the local areas mentioned in the application, Held, the Union was not disqualified for registration as Representative Union.
- The Rashtriya Ferro Manganese Kamga Sangh, Kanhan
- Bombay Industrial Relations Act, 1946, secsion 23(1)-Entering the Sangh in the approved list for the local area of Ramtek Taluka of Nagpur District.
- Ajit Industries, Bombay versus Workman Tukaram Sitaram Yevle employed under them. The contention that a semi-skilled employee was not a workman as per the definition of a workman under the provisions of the I. D. Act was rejected.
- Ramdnar M. Singh and Others, Bombay versus Rajkamal Silk Mills,— The wage board for the Silk Textile Industry in Maharashtra State in Reference No. 2 of 1964 gave an order on 30th September 1968 standardizing the weavers' wages. Consequent upon the standardization, the wages of some of the weavers were adversely affected. Held that there was no illegal deduction as alleged.
- Litho Press Kamgar Union, Nagpur.—Registration of Union for as Representative union for the Industry engaged in Printing Lithography, Photogravure or other similar work or work incidental to such process in the local area of Magpur Corporation.
- S.taram R. Chaturvidi versus B.E.S.T. Undertaking, Bombyy. - The Minimun Wages Act. 1947, 22(2). - The Court held that the application is not maintainable under section 20(1) of the Minimum Wages Act as the claim does not arise out of payment of less than minimum rates of wages prescribed under the Act. The claim arises out of the deduction from wages for which the appropriate forum is the Authority under the Payment of Wages Act and dismissed the application.
