## The Month in Brief

### Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class

The Bombay, Solapur and Nagpur Consumers Price Index Numbers for Working Class for the month of November 1977 with the average prices for the year ended December 1960 equal to 100 were 318, 326 and 323 respectively. The Jalgaon, Nanded, Pune and Aurangabad Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Class for the month of November 1977 with the average prices for the year ended December 1961 equal to 100 were 307, 327, 298 and 332 respectively.

### Industrial Disputes

During August 1977, there were 35 strikes involving 8,872 workmen and a time loss of 55,227 working days, as compared to 46 disputes in July 1977 involving 12,724 workmen and time-loss of 2,27,185 man-days. Further particulars of industrial disputes are given at pages 346 and 347 of this issue.

Thus declared Dr. Ram Kripal Sinha, Union Minister of State for Labour while inaugurating the National Course on Workers' Participation conducted here by the Central Institute of Workers' Education of the INTUC from December 1 to 8 at Vishwa Yuwa Cendra.

Dr. Sinha Congratulated the INTUC for having sponsored this course at an appropriate time when the Union Government had constituted a Tripartite Committee to go into the different aspects of participative management and also to evaluate the work done so far in this direction.

### Employers Told Not to Grudge Contributions

The Union Labour Minister, Shri Ravindra Varma, recently said the employers should not "grudge" commensurate and liberal contributions to social security funds.

"While the key to expansion of social security benefits no doubt lies in increased production and productivity," he pointed out, "no one should grudge his contribution to the cause of social security."

The employers, he said, could easily see that much of what they contributed to this fund, was, in one sense, financed by the Ex-chequer as deductible expenditure and part of it would have even otherwise gone to the workers as bonus.

Shri Varma made these observations while inaugurating a four-day Fifth Asian Trade Union Seminar on social security and effect of environment on working and living conditions.

The All India Trade Union Congress Chairman, Shri S. A. Dange presided.

Shri Varma said industrialisation had accentuated the needs for social security. On the one hand, it created a class of wage-earners who could not fend for themselves in the event of sickness, disablement or unemployment. On the other, it broke up the joint family system, the only effective means of protection from future uncertainties.

Referring to the oil seminar held recently in Norway, he said while the Government was yet to receive its recommendations, it was doing its best to initiate necessary action.

He said it was a pity that the social security benefits hardly percolated to areas and sections whose need was the greatest. How could these anomalies be removed, he asked.

He said the developed countries protected their workers by what was known as "indexation". But the Asian countries could hardly afford this luxury today. However, this did not mean that our workers should continue to suffer in terms of erosion of their deposits or the rate of interest, he said.

Shri Varma said : "The rural poor have to be led out of the morass of poverty and insecurity that have been engulfing them for many centuries. It is high time that we do something about it, and do it quickly."

He also warned against the problem of industrial pollution which was bound to increase with technological development and the extensive use of sophisticated machinery and industrial chemicals.

The Government, he said, was fully aware of the long term dangers of industrial pollution and the need for timely action. Presently the Government was seized of the question of enacting a law for the control of air pollution to provide suitable technical agencies.

These would be empowered to lay down statutory standards for emission levels of toxic gases, fumes and dust.

### No Absolute Rights for Anyone

The Prime Minister, Mr. Morarji Desai, declared on November 24, 1977 in the Rajya Sabha that there was "nothing like absolute right for anybody. Every right is subject to the right of the whole society. If the rights of the whole society are in danger the Government is bound to take action to prevent that danger".

The Prime Minister was intervening to reply to the CPM member, Mr. P. Ramamurthi, who had criticised the Madhya Pradesh Government's recent



ordinance empowering the Government to detain any person without trial. Mr. Ramamurthi pointed out that the right to strike by workers "is absolute and unfettered" under the constitution. Even in essential services the workers could go on strike after giving 15 days' notice during which time talks could be held to avert the strike.

#### **New Export Policy to give stress on Employment**

The export policy of the Government aims not only at earning more foreign exchange for the country, but also at increasing domestic employment opportunities, enhancing the export infrastructure, stabilising domestic prices and raising the standards of living of the people. It, therefore, gives emphasis on employment oriented industries like woollens.

This was said by the Union Minister for Commerce, Civil Supplies and Co-operation, Shri Mohan Dharia, while addressing a meeting of the Committee of Administration of the Woolland Woollen Export Promotion Council, here today. He expressed satisfaction that the exports of wool and woollen products during April-November 1977 have increased to Rs. 651.1 million as compared to Rs. 601.3 million during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

The Minister agreed with the Council regarding the need to simplify the official procedures connected with imports and exports and said that a high powered committee formed under the Chairmanship of Commerce Secretary, was looking into it. The Committee, which would suggest improvements in the structure and use of instruments of policy and rationalisation and simplification of procedures and suggest appropriate changes in the organisation of the Chief Controller of Imports and Exports and other related agencies, already had exhaustive discussions with the representatives of trade and industry and was scheduled to submit its report shortly.

#### **Go-Slow Policy on Job Creation Threatens New Economic Slide**

The administration's wait-and-hope approach to recession-level-unemployment wont offset the elements that could brew a terrible economic situation in the months ahead, AFL-CIO Research Director Rudy Oswald warned.

"We still haven't recovered from the last disaster," Oswald said, adding that with real un-employment hanging at 10 per cent, further postponement of an aggressive drive to create a great many more jobs than the limited programmes now in the work will produce increases the risk of a new economic downturn. He said that Administration spokesmen make a mistake when they view the three-month decline of leading economic indicators and signs of other problems as only a temporary lull after 29 months of economic growth.

"For the economy to stop growing after 29 months would be a disaster," Oswald declared on Labor News Conference. "It would mean another recession growing out of the very high levels of unemployment."

Nothing that the Administration seems to have shifted from its goal of cutting the unemployment rate of 6.5 per cent by the end of this year to 4.7 per cent unemployment by 1981, Oswald said that "stretched-out time-table would leave us, for the next three years, at unacceptably high levels of unemployment." And even at the end of that scenario in 1981, the unemployment rate would, be much too high, he added.

"We need to bring unemployment down at least to the 3 to 3.5 per cent level, and to do that expeditiously," Oswald asserted. He said the AFL-CIO supports the basic programmes to create jobs that have been undertaken in recent months, but he urged that they should be vastly expanded. He said the expenditures that have been committed are "too minuscule to meet the major problem that we face today."

He renewed the call for stepped-up emphasis on direct job-creation programmes in public works, restoration of the nation's railbeds, water and sewer facilities, mass transportation, urban development and housing—particularly homes for low and middle income families.

### Senate Panel modifies forced Retirement Bill

The Senate Human Resources Committee has approved curbs on mandatory retirement that are similar, but not identical, to the bill that passed the House.

Both measures would amend the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, which generally bars mandatory retirement at any age below 65. The coverage—and the curb on forced retirement—would be raised to age 70.

The House passed Bill would take effect six months after enactment but the Senate measure would not apply until January 1, 1979. The later effective date was urged by President Carter to allow more time to plan the transition.

Where a mandatory retirement age under 70 has been set by a union-negotiated pension plan, both bills would allow a longer transition. The law would not apply until the expiration of the contract or two years, whichever period is shorter.

The Senate committee also voted to exclude school teachers and tenured college professors. This would allow schools and colleges to require persons over 65 to retire. The argument made in committee was that otherwise there would be insufficient turnover to provide jobs for "a new generation of scholars.

Also exempted by the Senate panel were executives who receive private pensions—excluding social security—of more than \$20,000.

Both the House and the Senate would allow occupational exemptions where age is generally acknowledged as a factor in job performance.

The House bill would have prohibited mandatory retirement at any set age in the federal civil service, except in specified high hazard jobs. The mandatory retirement age for most federal workers is now 70.

By contrast, the Senate bill does not change the federal civil service retirement rules.

### **New Trade Policies Sought to Save Jobs**

Four union leaders have urged President Carter "to dismiss any remaining reluctance to reform foreign trade policies and laws" in an effort to save the jobs "of large numbers of workers in threatened industries."

The appeal came in a letter to Carter from Sec., Treas. Jacob Clayman of the AFL-CIO Industrial Union Department, President David Fitzmaurice of the Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers, President George M. Parker of the Flint Glass Workers, and President Charles H. Pillard of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers.

The letter, written in the wake of Zenith Radio Corporation's announced layoff of 5,600 television and stereo production workers, expressed serious concern "about the future of the manufacturing industries of America" under the impact of cheaply produced imports.

The four union leaders cited figures indicating a drop of approximately one million manufacturing jobs between 1974 and 1976, blaming "an important portion of these lay-offs" on the "great flood of foreign imports."

They advocate renewed government action and enforcement of already existing laws to remedy "America's appalling lack of defense" against imports whose production is based on low wages and whose nations of origin put up complex barriers to the import of American-made products.

The letter cited estimates of lay-offs caused by unfair imports in recent years. The hardest-hit sectors were electronics and electronic machinery, 1,50,000 jobs; textiles and apparel 3,00,000; shoes, 70,000; and primary metals, 1,00,000.

Meanwhile, the labor-industry coalition attempting to save the domestic market for America made color television receivers charged that an "unrealistic U.S. government policy and Japanese trade barriers both contributed to the elimination of 5,600 American jobs at Zenith Radio Corporation facilities"

### **Training in Workers' Participation in Decisions within Undertakings**

A symposium called by the International Labour Office in Geneva from 10th October to 21st October 1977, discussed training of workers' representatives for participation on decisions within undertakings, and reviewed training needs, programmes and possibilities for international action in this sphere. About twenty participants, mostly trade union representatives and worker's education specialists, have attended the symposium.

Workers participate in many ways in management decisions. In many countries, including Australia, Canada, Italy, Japan, Nigeria, U.K., U.S., many Latin American and most Caribbean countries, the main form of workers' participation is collective bargaining. Self-management is practised in Yugoslavia and a few other places. In countries such as Austria and Federal Republic of Germany and in Scandinavia, workers' representatives participate on management and supervisory bodies. Both in developing and industrialised countries, the most common form of participation is embodied in the "works council" and similar types of machinery, where problems of concern both to management and to workers are discussed jointly, in order to influence management decisions on such questions as production, personnel and the working environment. In the USSR and other Eastern European countries, economic reforms introduced in the mid-1960s were accompanied by an expansion of workers' participation in the management of production and decision-making through trade union committees and other means.

All these systems make increasing demands on the unions. Their representatives may be called upon to read balance-sheets and comment on legal points, to discuss productivity and accident statistics or to have clear views on wider personnel, organisational and environmental questions. In fact, to present union positions convincingly, they have to become specialists.

The report prepared by the ILO for this meeting shows that workers' education plays an important role in this respect by putting workers' representatives on an equal footing with their partners. In most countries with some form of workers' participation, introduction of such schemes has been followed by considerable efforts to organise educational programmes for workers' representatives, often initiated and carried out by the trade union movement itself. The ILO organised symposium also discussed training needs and target groups, aims, scope and contents of training programmes.

#### An extra week's annual leave for older workers in Norway

Workers aged 60 and over are entitled to a fifth week of annual leave under a law enacted in Norway. The law amends the 1947 Act on holidays, which provides that most workers in Norway are entitled to 24 working days' annual leave. Whereas the employer normally decides when annual leave is to be taken, the question of the timing of the extra annual leave is to be decided by agreement between the employer and the workers concerned, either collectively or individually. If no such agreement has been made, the worker may decide when to take the extra leave, but he must give the employer at least two weeks' advance notice before taking it, unless an agreement provides otherwise. The extra leave may, unless otherwise stipulated by agreement, be divided into portions of one annual leave day at a time.

Under the 1947 Act, a worker whose contract lasts for at least six days is entitled to an annual leave compensation from his employer equal to 9.5 per

## Gist of important Notifications under Labour Laws

(a) “ canteen or club employees ” means a person employed in a canteen or club not falling under entry 13 of Part I of the Schedule to the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (XI of 1948) in any areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule and in respect of whom minimum rates of wages are fixed by Government Notifications, Industries, Energy and Labour Department, No. MWA.3676/1240/Lab-7, dated the 13th July, 1977 ;

(b) “ meal ” means a full and wholesome meal consisting of items of food such as rice, chapatis or bhakri or bread, vegetable, dal, mutton, fish and curry ;

(c) “ nasta ” means one dish of snacks along with tea.

(d) “ Schedule ” means the schedule appended to these rules ;

(e) the expression, “ child ” and “ adolescent ”, shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Minimum Wages Act, 1948.

*Computation of cash value.*—The cash value of the minimum rates of wages to be paid to canteen or club employees partly in kind, per month (that is, in the form of free meal, nasta or tea) under Government Notification, Industries, Energy and Labour Department, No. MWA.3676/1240/Lab-7, dated the 13th July, 1977.

# Consumer Price Index Numbers for Working Class for November 1977

## BOMBAY\*

318—A fall of 3 points

In November, 1977, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Bombay Centre with base : January to December 1965 equal to 100 was 318 being 3 points lower than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at the Bombay Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 5 points to 345 due mainly to a fall in the average prices of bajra, groundnut oil, vanaspati, milk-purified ghee, chillies dry, chillies green, onions, lavang, sugar, tea leaf and cold drinks.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc. group decreased by 2 points to 342 due mainly to a fall in the average price of pan leaf only.

The index number for fuel and light group decreased by 2 points to 380 due mainly to a fall in the average prices of coal only.

The index number for the clothing, bedding and footwear group, tobacco, miscellaneous group and housing is constant at 327, 253 and 145 respectively.

## SOLAPUR\*

## 326—A fall of 1 point

In November 1977, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Solapur Centre with base January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 326 being 1 point lower than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey in Solapur City.

The index number for the food group decreased by 3 points to 346 due to a fall in the average prices of jowar, groundnut oil, vanaspati, chillies green, chillies dry, coconut, sugar, gur, and fall in the sub-group index number for vegetable and fruits.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc. group decreased by 2 points to 299 due to a fall in the average prices of pan leaf only.

The index number for the fuel and light and the miscellaneous groups and housing remained steady at 336, 258 and 188 respectively.

The index number for the clothing, bedding and footwear group increased by 2 points to 358 due to a rise in the average prices of doti, and long cloth.

In November 1977, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Nagpur Centre with base year January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 323 being 2 points lower than that in the preceding month. The index number for the food group decreased by 10 points to 325 due to a fall in the average prices of rice, groundnut, oil, milk, ghee, dry chillies, onions, brinjals other vegetables sugar and gur.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 1 points to 354 due to a rise in the prices of match box only.

The index number for housing remained steady at 130.

The index number for the clothing and footwear group remained steady at 330.

The index number for the miscellaneous group remained steady at 243.

## 332—A rise of 7 points

In November 1977 the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class for Aurangabad Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 332 being 7 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the Standard of Life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at Aurangabad Centre.

The Index Number for the food group increased by 10 points to 364 due to a rise in the average prices of Rice, turdal, gramdal, moongdal, masurdal, turmeric, chillies dry, zcra, potatoes, onion, garlic, other vegetable and gur,

The index numbers for the fuel and light group increased by 2 points to 325 due to a rise in the price of firewood.

The index number for housing remained steady at 217.

The index number for the Clothing and Footwear group increased by 4 points to 336 due to a rise in the prices of Saree, Long cloth and coloured fabric.

The Index Number for the Miscellaneous group increased by 4 points to 264 due to a rise in the prices of pan-leaf, pan-finished with Masala, washing soap and Daily mixture.

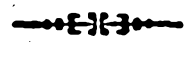
